We have been busy preparing for our training season to kick off in March. I have been circulating the required background forms from the Park District and soliciting our new members on our efforts. Our members and our training team are in place, and I am proud to be a part of this service we offer to our community.

I am happy to announce that our first Trap Fundamentals Class has a waiting list. We can handle 15 students using our club guns. I am pitching in a gun and Dave Krause is also pitching in a gun so we can take 17 students. David Naydenoff from the Park District has been working with us to coordinate our resources in order to serve as many as possible.

We have (6) Trap Fundamentals Classes, (2) Hunter Education Field Day classes, Ducks Unlimited Day on March 22nd, and another Conceal Carry 16 hour / 3 Hour Renewal coming up. (Look for the date as we form the CC classes.) I have extended an invitation to the Scouts of America, (formally Boy Scouts of America) to have a shotgun merit badge class.

Finally, I would like to congratulate Ken Lindstrom's election as a board member of the Newark Sportsman's Club. Ken was my Master Hunter Education Instructor, has helped with our classes, the NIHFD event, and a good friend and shooter. <u>Firearm Safety Corner</u>

There is a new state Bill # SB 2535 offered by Jason Plummer (R) Edwardsville, Il. that would abolish FOID cards in this state. As we have witnessed in recent times, the system is not providing the goals it was hoped to do. The administration of the system is plagued with financial and administrative problems. This bill will start winding through the committees and hopefully be passed. Please keep your eye on it.

Although our club does not solicit or advertise products and services related to our sport, I would like to offer my observations. I have just finished a book written by Dr. John R. Lott Jr. It was titled, "More Guns Less Crime." It was a heavily researched factual book offering substantial facts, statistics, and historical events proving the point that self-defense is a right not a licensed or legislated law. The use of guns to provide self-defense by law abiding citizens has proven to reduce crime, save lives, and promote the goals established by the Preamble of our Constitution to name a few. This dates right back to old English Common Law from the 1700's. At times it is long winded and redundant but presses the well-aimed point of its title. (Currently it is estimated that there are over 309 million guns, 17 million AR style rifles circulating in our country. We have again set a new record for NSCI background checks for 2019.)

As I have mentioned in past articles. Members who enjoy our shooting sports, and responsibility to Conceal Carry, should always continue their training by books of this nature, firearm combat classes, gun retention classes and the ever-changing political leftwing approach on our rights. 




