He had just finished a 30-day training class from out of state that teaches law enforcement on the topic of Pot. NSC has 7 shooters at Illinois State ATA shoot; Ralph Nelson, Tom Clark, Mike Moore earn two trophies each

NSC had seven members participate in this year's Illinois State Trapshooting championships, sanctioned by the Amateur Trapshooting Association (ATA).

The state shoot is held at Brittany Shooting Park in Bunker Hill. Bunker Hill is located about 30 minutes southwest of Litchfield, just south of Springfield. The Illinois state shoot runs for six days, with the championship events being contested the last two days. The singles championship is held on Saturday, and the doubles and handicap championships are on Sunday. The facility has 24 trap fields for the events, along with a practice trap.

The state shoot has a well-earned reputation for having some of the wettest weather each year. Shooters were fortunate for most of the week, with only a brief shower on Wednesday afternoon. But on Saturday the start of the singles championship was delayed for two-hours due to thunderstorms, and then around 1 pm heavy rains rolled thru the area, soaking any shooter that was on the line at the time. It was also cool and very windy during the week, with winds as high as 20-25 miles per hour. After the rain on Saturday temps returned to normal and the winds died down, but scores suffered in the early part of the week.

Ralph Nelson and Dave Peace started shooting on the opening day (Tuesday), with Ralph shooting just the 16-yard events for the first three days, and Dave shooting all events the first two days. Tom Clark started shooting on Wednesday, and was joined by Denny Mills, Bob Ash, Mike Moore and Scott Calhoun joined in on Thursday.

Trophies

Ralph Nelson, Tom Clark, and Mike Moore all bagged two trophies each.

Ralph won the Hall of Fame Singles D-class winner's trophy on Wednesday with a score of 95, and also won the D-class runner-up trophy in the Singles Class Championship on Thursday. Ralph was tied for high score in D-class but dropped back to runner-up since he didn't shoot the singles even on Saturday, which was the tiebreaker.

Tom won the Baker Farms Doubles D-class winner's trophy on Wednesday firing a 92. Tom also brought home the High Overall D-class winner's trophy for the highest overall score in all events Wednesday thru Sunday.

Mike earned the Veteran category runner-up trophy in the Doubles Class Championship on Friday with a score of 89. Mike tied for winner but fell back to runner-up after coming up short in the carry-over doubles event on Sunday. Mike posted a 193 in the Illinois Singles Championship on Saturday, good enough for the Veteran category runner-up trophy.






